





### Thank You ESVA Freedom Starters!


Five years ago, in 2014, Melanie Parker started to make kits for the survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault containing the necessities that every person needs; shampoos, toothpastes, deodorant, & etc. With the expectation of only being able to do a couple kits, she managed to gather a community together to supply over 116. The following year she decided to help make Christmas season even more special for our survivors, and every year since the Freedom Starters (as the group is now called) has taken it upon themselves to become the local team of Santa Clauses and bring holiday cheer to each individual who is impacted by domestic violence/sexual assault. This year they managed to supply over 50 different people with gifts under their trees. ESCADV deeply appreciates everything the Freedom Starters have done and will do to help us in our mission of bringing empowerment to all.





We encourage you to learn and teach your teen(s) these red flags when starting a new relationship:

- Excessive jealousy or insecurity
- ♦ Invasions of your privacy
- Unexpected bouts of anger or rage
- Pressuring a partner into unwanted sexual activity
- Blaming you for problems in the relationship and not taking any responsibility for the same
- ♦ Controlling tendencies
- ♦ Falsely accusing you of things
- Vandalizing or ruining your personal property
- Taunting or bullying
- Threatening or causing physical violence



One in three teenagers experience dating violence, one in five experience physical or sexual abuse from their boyfriend/girlfriend. Teenage dating violence is more prevalent than we believe, learn the signs today to help your teen remain safe and empowered.
